Your vision is my top priority, so feel free to reach out to me anytime with updates or big ideas; my line is always open for you.



PRO TIP

Have guests RSVP with their choice of Entrée. It will save time when guests take their seats after Cocktail Hour.

I. CEREMONY

The Prelude: Submit your specific theme playlist—whether it's acoustic pop or cinematic scores—to set the mood as guests arrive.

The Entrance: For modern weddings, the Officiant leads the way, followed by a dedicated **Groom's March**.

III. RECEPTION - B. C. & D.

The Strategic Timeline

Dinner & Dancing: We move the First Dance and Speeches to the very start of the reception. This allows dinner to happen earlier, clearing the way for a much longer dance set later.

Dining in Style: For buffet service, I work with the venue staff to dismiss tables. We avoid calling table numbers over the mic—this isn't a cafeteria!

D. Dinner:

- If you have a specific playlist for Dinner Time send that playlist to DJ Maxx.
- If Dinner is not ready or is running late I will open the dance floor for couples. Slow dancing first! We don't want to hit the guests with the bangers yet.



PRO TIP

Your photographers will love you if you dance through your entire First Dance song. It gives them the time to capture every angle of that "just married" glow.

III. RECEPTION - E. F. & G.

The Parent Dances:

These happen toward the end of dinner to transition the mood.

F. Bride and Groom Dance Trap:

The Dance Trap: This is a game-changer. After a brief thank-you speech from you, you'll point at me, and I'll drop the beat. You then lead your guests directly onto the floor—guests follow the couple, not a DJ yelling into a mic.

PRO TIP

Usually Parent Dances are shorter than the 1st Dance. Please let DJ Maxx know when to fade out your song.

III. RECEPTION - H. I. & J.

NOTES

Usually I will encourage the Bride and Groom to say a quick thank you speech to all the guests prior to Cake Cutting.

H. Cake - 🎵 Background Song:

I. Bouquet - 🎵 Background Song:

If you don't have many single ladies attending we can make your Bouquet Toss for married women or you can dedicate your Bouquet to a very special person in your life.

J. Groom's Toss - 🎵 Background Song:

The Modern Toss: Ditch the dated garter toss for the Groom's Toss. Throw a football from your favorite team, an Amazon gift card, or even the box of your favorite spirit (we'll keep the glass safe!). It gets everyone on the floor without the "cringe" factor.



Private Cake Cutting

Want more dance time? Opt for a private cake cutting for the photographer. It keeps the party from losing its rhythm.

III. RECEPTION - K. L. & M.

NOTES

Dessert time is usually a mixture of guests enjoying the dance floor, desserts and mingling. The dance floor usually slows down but will quickly rebuild.

After dessert when the dance floor rebuilds older guests might leave. I usually pump up your best bangers during this time.

The "One More Song" Tradition
